**Welcome Home Vietnam  
Veterans Day**

On Veterans Day 1996, the Vietnam Veterans Memorial  
Fund unveiled a half-scale replica of the Vietnam Veterans  
Memorial in Washington, D.C., designed to travel to com-  
munities throughout the United States. "Bringing The Wall  
Home" to communities throughout our country allows the  
souls enshrined on the Memorial to exist, once more,  
among family and friends in the peace and comfort of  
familiar surroundings. The traveling exhibit, known as *The  
Wall That Heals*, allows the many thousands of veterans  
who have been unable to cope with the prospect of "facing  
The Wall" to find the strength and courage to do so within  
their own communities, thus allowing the healing process  
to begin.

*The Wall That Heals* also features a Traveling Museum  
and Information Center providing a comprehensive educa-  
tional component to enrich and complete visitors' experi-  
ences. The Museum chronicles the Vietnam War era and  
the unique healing power of the Vietnam Veterans Memo-  
rial, while the Information Center serves as a venue for  
people to learn about friends & loved ones lost in the war.

Since its dedication, *The Wall That Heals* has visited more  
than 300 cities and towns throughout the nation, spreading  
the Memorial's healing legacy to millions. In addition to its  
U.S. tour stops, the exhibition made its first-ever interna-  
tional journey in April 1999 to the Four Provinces of Ireland  
to honor the Irish-born casualties of the Vietnam War and  
the Irish-Americans who served. It has also traveled to  
Canada.

fishing pier on the larger of the two lakes in the park. Fifty-nine-feet long with a 48-foot wide T-section  
at the end, it has low handrail sections allowing easy access for children and anglers confined to  
wheelchairs. A solar-powered fish feeder within casting distance of the new pier is planned.

## GOVERNMENT BUZZ

Sen. Burr introduced a "Welcome Home Vietnam Veterans Day" Resolution to honor service members who fought in Vietnam. **March 30<sup>th</sup>** marks the anniversary of the day in 1973 that combat & combat support units withdrew completely from South Vietnam under the terms of the Treaty of Paris. More than 58,000 members of the United States Armed Forces lost their lives and more than 300,000 were wounded in Vietnam. "Our soldiers served honorably and bravely in Vietnam. Unfortunately, they arrived home to a country in political turmoil, and never received the recognition they deserve," Burr said. "By setting **March 30<sup>th</sup>** aside as a day to focus on our Vietnam veterans, we can show our unified gratitude for their service and the sacrifices that these veterans made on our behalf." Burr encouraged communities to commemorate this day by honoring Vietnam veterans in their area.

*What is your business or organization doing for this? Offering discounts on that day to veterans? Items can be donated to veterans at ABCCM: intersection Hwy 70 & I-40 exit 55.*

*How does this pertain to business here? Many funeral processions travel Hwy 70 from I-40 exit 59 onto Grovestone Road each year. It would be nice if we worked together to recognize them in some way on their final journey.*

North Carolina's State Energy Office has a new program offering grants from \$100,000 - \$500,000 for energy efficiency upgrades such as solar electricity, solar-thermal systems, and installation of energy efficient lighting for owners of commercial or industrial facilities & is made possible by federal funding from ARRA (whoever THEY are). Projects must be able to be implemented quickly & recipient entity will need to manage the work itself. Application deadline is Mar. 9, 2pm.
